# An Englishman in Miyazaki

# "Pancakes, Buns and... More Chocolate?!"

Hi again everyone! It's finally starting to warm up again! Around the end of March or start of April in the UK (it's based on the old lunar calendar), we celebrate Easter, which is technically a religious holiday based around rebirth and the removal of evil spirits, but nowadays is more about chocolate and, oddly enough, pancakes. Traditionally, people would fast for Lent, which is the 40-day period leading up to Easter, and so the night before, it was popular to use up all the luxury items like milk, eggs and butter that would spoil otherwise, and make pancakes (technically crepes, but that's what we call pancakes in the UK!). This is why the UK calls Shrove Tuesday "Pancake Day." Similarly, Easter is originally a religious

festival, but nowadays people are more interested in exchanging chocolate eggs and eating Hot Cross Buns – sweet currant buns with a cross marked in the top. It is also now a popular practice to entertain children at Easter by hiding decorated eggs and getting them to go and search for them – because of this, the term "Easter Egg" is often used to refer o a hidden feature, particularly in films or video games – has anyone found any interesting Easter Eggs lately? Let me know!
