

A Scot in Miyazaki

"Remember, remember the 5th of November, gunpowder, treason and plot!"

I am sure many will agree that the summer season is characterised in Japan by the many festivals and fireworks. As we enter the later months of the year, there are fewer of these festivities, however, it is quite the opposite in the UK. Although we do not have summer 'matsuri', every year, in the first week of November, the skies are lit up with bonfires and fireworks, as the UK celebrates 'Guy Fawkes Night'.

This festival, despite being one of the more famous annual celebrations back home, seems to be little known across the world. Every year, on the 5th of November, known as 'Guy Fawkes Night' or 'Bonfire Night/ Fireworks Night', the people of the UK commemorate a failed assassination attempt from more than 400 years ago. On November 5th, 1605, a man named Guy Fawkes, who was a member of the group known as 'the Gunpowder Plot', was arrested while guarding explosives that had been placed under Parliament's House of Lords in an attempt to assassinate King James 1st. In celebration of the King surviving, people lit bonfires around London. Months later, the 5th of November was made an annual public day of thanksgiving for the plot's failure and has remained so



ever since! Typically, on this day bonfires and effigies of Fawkes (or more often now, modern political leaders or societal villains) are burned while fireworks burst in the sky. Traditionally, people feast on baked potatoes and toffee apples, and often families and friends will go out together to see fireworks displays. Admittedly it is a bit colder at this time of year than the Japanese summer fireworks festivals, but it is a unique holiday deeply rooted in the history of the UK and is an event that I would recommend to anyone who can be in the UK at this time. Don't worry if you don't know where to go, because I guarantee on this day you will be able to let the fireworks guide your way!
