Healthcare in Japan is world-class, prompt, and affordable. Japanese doctors are not only highly competent and very thorough, but also caring and compassionate. I have never had to wait more than a few minutes to be seen, even without an appointment, and tests the doctor orders are done right away with results returned quickly. Pharmacies are located right next to clinics, so it's quick and easy to have prescriptions filled. And in the 35 years I've been in Miyazaki, I've never spent more than a few hundred yen for such great care!

With her mild weather, Miyazaki is also a great place for outdoor fun to keep active as we age. Her beautiful blue ocean offers surfing and fishing, and her clean rivers are perfect for canoeing and kayaking. Miyazaki's mountains provide lovely scenery for cycling and jogging; and speaking of mountains, Miyazaki is a hiker's paradise. After an active day of outdoor exercise, there are also many hot springs where you can soak your tired muscles in a soothing bath.
